She has been Association President on two occasions firstly in 1991 and again in 2010.

Linda has had a varied and successful career where her thoughts and opinions are highly valued. Starting at Liverpool City Council in 1974 she moved through the ranks before taking up the Head of Revenues and Benefits Role at Preston City Council in 1988. From Preston Linda moved into the Private sector IT market taking up roles with Psec, Bull and finally being Head of Product at Anite in 2000. Returning back to Local Authorities Linda worked for Sefton for a further 8 years as Assistant Director of IT and then as Client Contract Manager; still not satisfied

before taking retirement she spent 8 more years as a Product Manager for Destin

Solutions.

This doesn't mean that Linda will be vanishing from the scene, she will still be involved in organising our hugely successful Annual Dinner Dance and retired colleagues lunches.
